1. Mapping Overview

Objectives

- Identify and document the landscape of key nutrition actors and actions across multiple sectors and link their activities, target groups and implementation mechanisms

Who does what, where and how?

- Inform coverage of beneficiaries

What % of the target group is covered?

- Identify which actions are not adequately addressed and inform scale up of nutrition actions

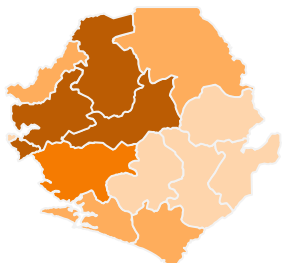
How and where to strengthen key nutrition actions?



Engage a dialogue with stakeholders to scale key nutrition actions in the country

What can the Nutrition Stakeholder & Action Mapping help you with?

For Provinces & Districts



- See which partners are working on food & nutrition actions in your province
- Gain information on which actions are being conducted and where
- Know how many beneficiaries are being reached by different actions and which actions may need to be scaled up

For Ministries



- Get a better overview of who the partners are and what they do
- Identify potential gaps in the coverage of districts and coverage of beneficiaries of actions
- Help planning & scale up of nutrition actions

For UN and NGOs



- Enhance coordination though better information on which organizations are working in the same districts and/or on the same actions
- Identify which districts need further support
- See which actions may need to be scaled up and where

For Donors



- Identify which districts need further support
- See which actions need more funds to scale up
- Help identify which organizations can cover different actions and districts

Improve coordination among partners and provide necessary information for strengthening nutrition actions and planning purposes

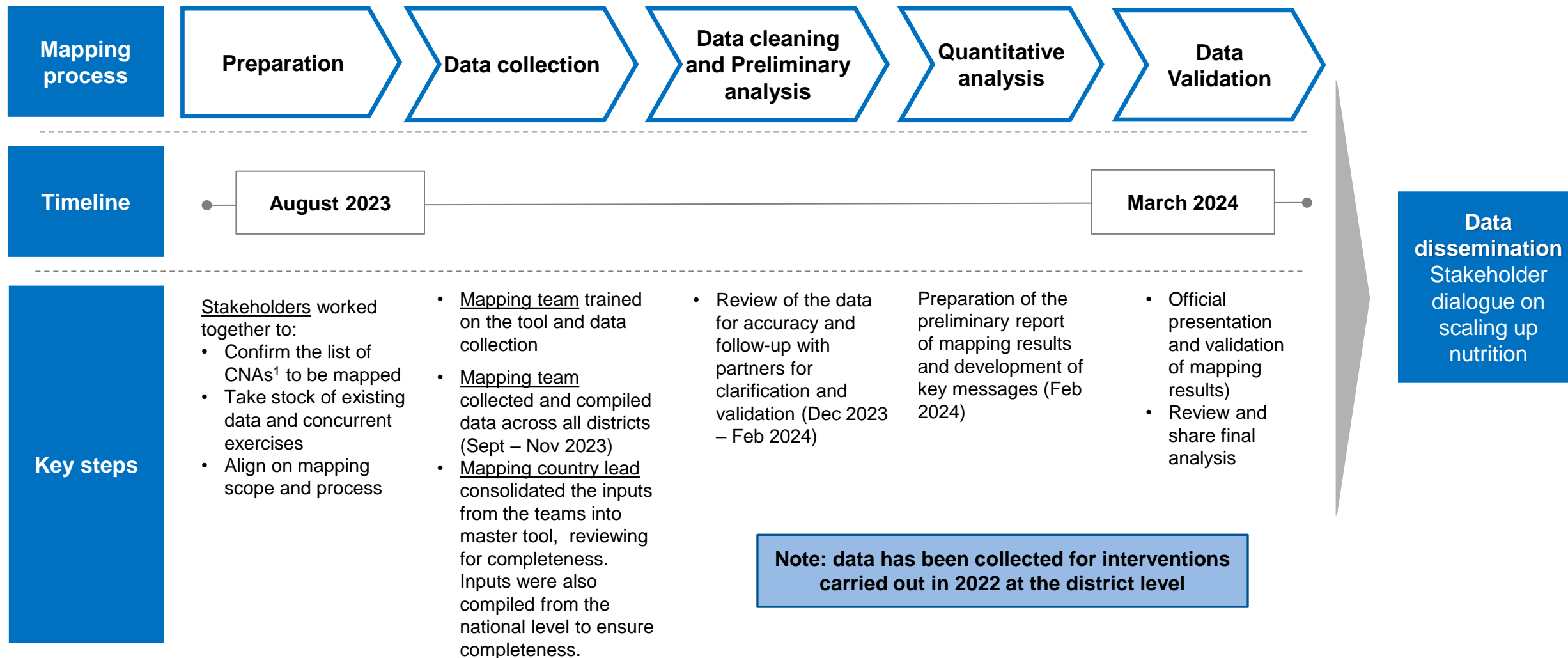

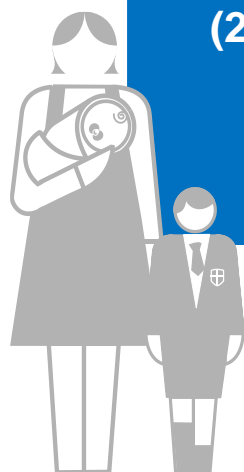
Mapping Specific Definitions

Responsible Ministry	Ministry, department or institution of the Government participating in the monitoring and evaluation of the action	Action	These are the nutrition activities or interventions that were chosen to be mapped identified in consultation with multi-sectoral stakeholders engaged in nutrition
Implementer	This role refers to all partners delivering nutrition actions directly to the beneficiaries	Delivery mechanism	A list of country-specific mechanisms that define how an action has been implemented
Catalyst	Partners who provide coordination, M&E, and/or technical assistance to the nutrition actions being mapped.	Geographic coverage	Percentage of geographical areas in which an action has been carried out (where at least one stakeholder has reached a beneficiary)
Donor	This role refers to partners who provide funding for the identified nutrition actions	Population coverage	Percentage of target group that benefited from an action, compared to the total size of that target group

• A stakeholder may assume several roles for a single action (e.g. the responsible ministry may also be the field implementer through its public servants)
 • Some roles may not be filled for each action
 • The donor role includes donors and technical partners who have funded implementing organizations

• 'Delivery mechanisms' can be strategies (e.g. campaigns or routines), human capital (e.g. extension workers, religious leaders), approaches (e.g. community-led, health centres), etc. The set of options is country-specific and decided by the government and partners engaged in nutrition

In order to determine coverage, total population of key target groups was gathered



The population of most of the key target groups for the mapping year (2020) was based on estimates from the 2019 census (e.g. stunting, children 0-59 months, women of reproductive age)

For a few of the key target groups alternative sources or additional calculations had to be made:

- **Annual caseload of children with SAM & MAM**
- **Number of extension workers/Crop officers**
- **Smallholder farmers**
- **Emergency affected populations**

Disclaimer for the Nutrition Stakeholder & Action Mapping

The Sierra Leone Nutrition Stakeholder & Action Mapping intends to help improve nutrition coordination and scale-up discussions by providing an indicative overview of [who the stakeholders in nutrition are](#), [where they are working](#), and [estimated coverage of beneficiaries for selected Core Nutrition Actions](#).

Both the [geographical and beneficiary coverage are estimated](#) based on the information provided and obtained at the district level. The coverage is therefore [not to be considered as exhaustive or exact](#). Moreover, [it is voluntary to report](#), and not necessarily all stakeholders have been identified or have chosen to contribute.

The mapping has only collected data on [selected Core Nutrition Actions](#). Organizations, both included in this mapping and not, may be working on other actions that are important for improving nutrition outcomes, however data on these actions has not been captured in this mapping. Furthermore, this mapping is [not assessing the quality](#) or accuracy of the reported coverage. Rather it can be used as an indicator of where certain areas or actions should be analyzed further.

Nutrition Actions were selected through consultations with the country SUN secretariat, Government Ministries and Departments, the UN agencies, and civil society groups. In addition, the analysis presented herein utilizes maps that do not incorporate the two recently established provinces of Falaba and Kenema. However, these provinces are duly identified within the core nutrition action plan with designated boxes for reference. It is imperative to acknowledge that the exclusion of Falaba and Kenema from the maps does not diminish their significance within the context of the analysis. Users are encouraged to refer to the core nutrition action plan for comprehensive information regarding these provinces.

In addition, some [difficulties](#) were encountered [in the collection and analysis of data](#) in Sierra Leone:

- Non-returned questionnaires or unavailable key persons;
- Available information to identify national and district-level target populations.
- The response/reaction time of organizations often longer than expected;
- The unavailability of data disaggregated by intervention, target groups or at the district level;
- Some target groups did not systematically correspond to the reports calculated or collected by the different actors.

The results of this exercise should thus only be interpreted as [indicative and directional](#) in the context of a first exercise. [Future iterations will help to refine the approach and improve the quality of the results](#).

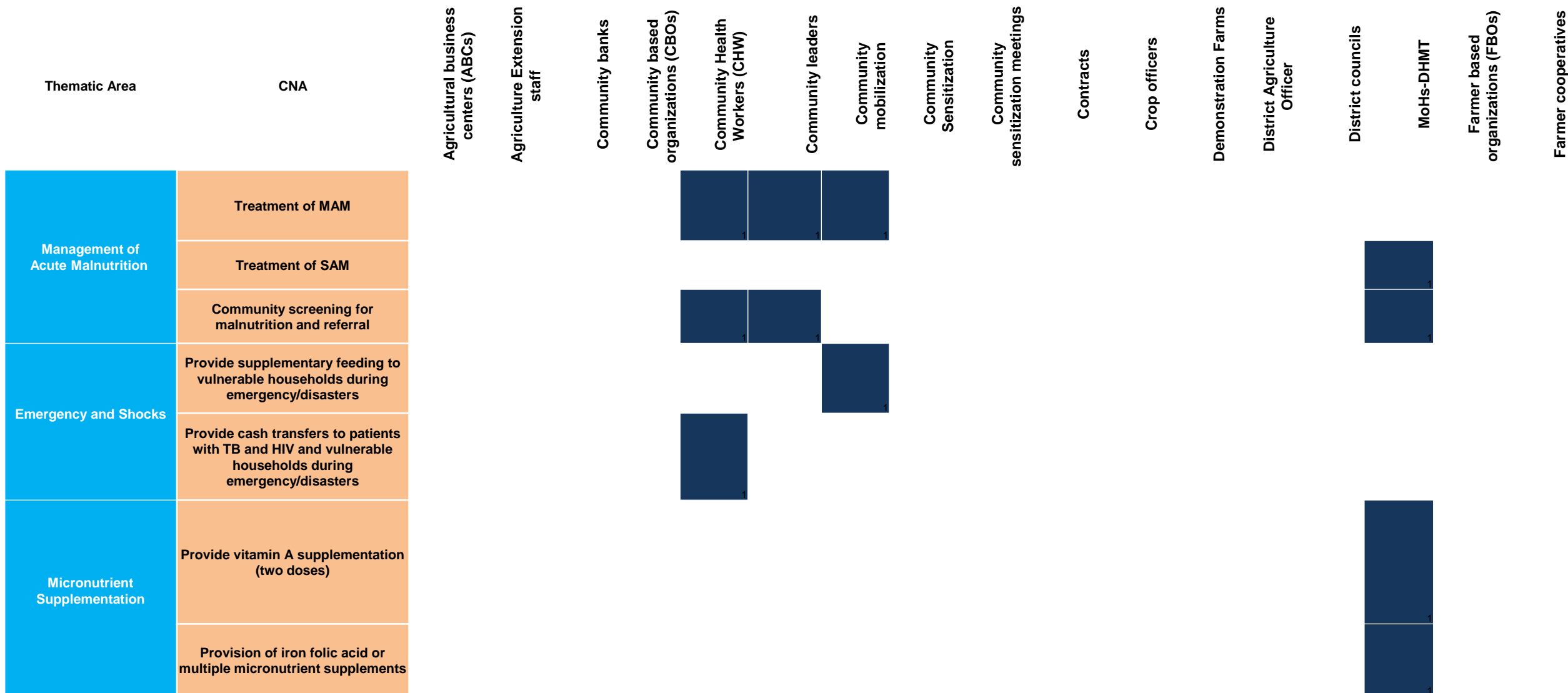

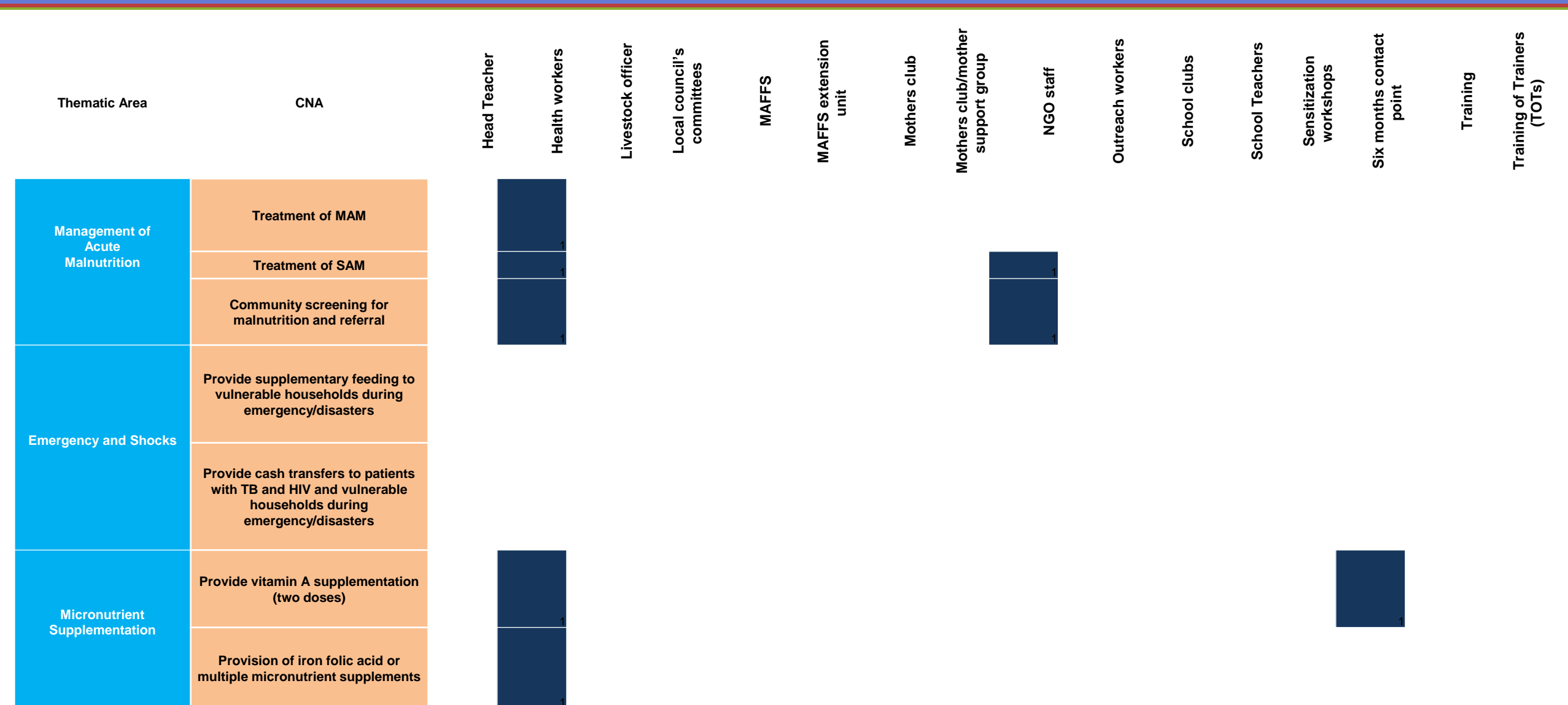

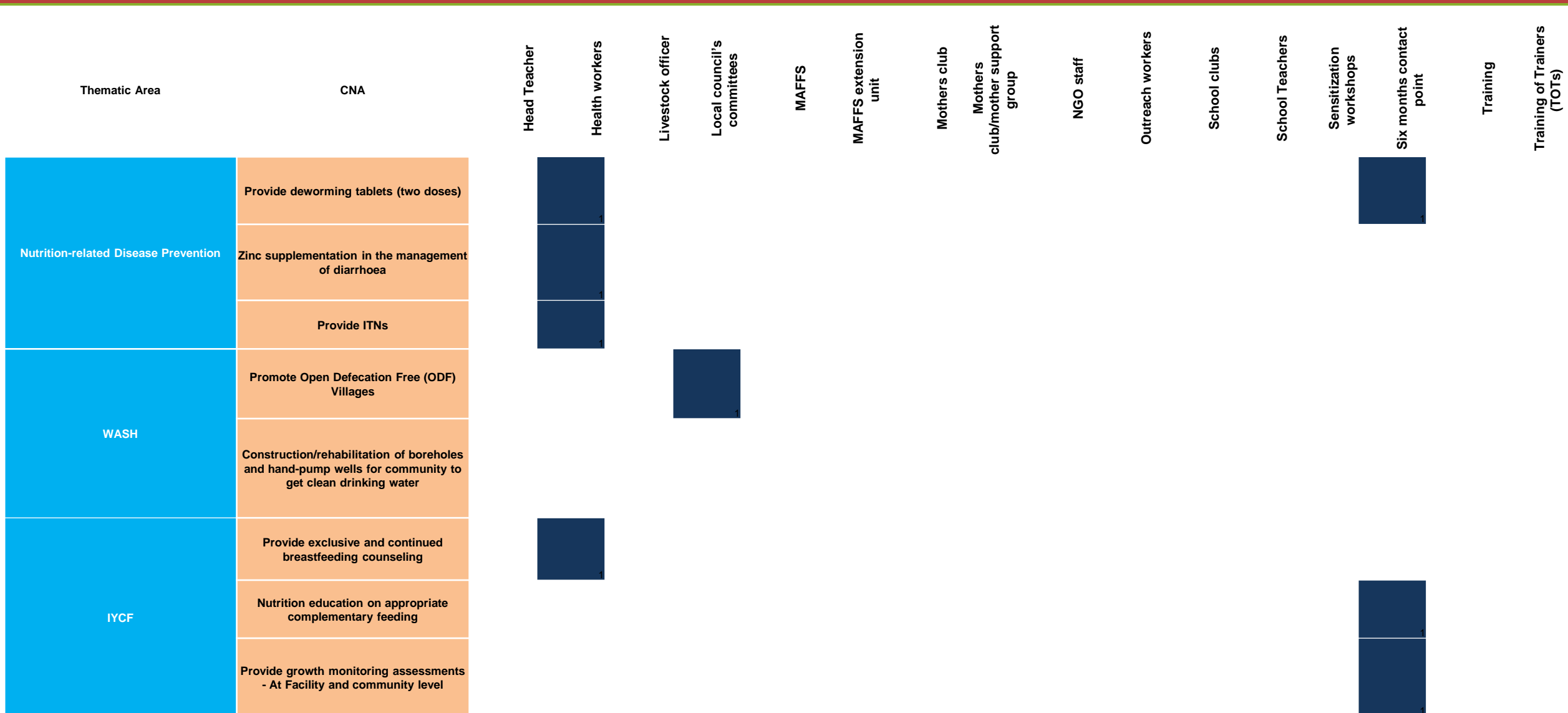

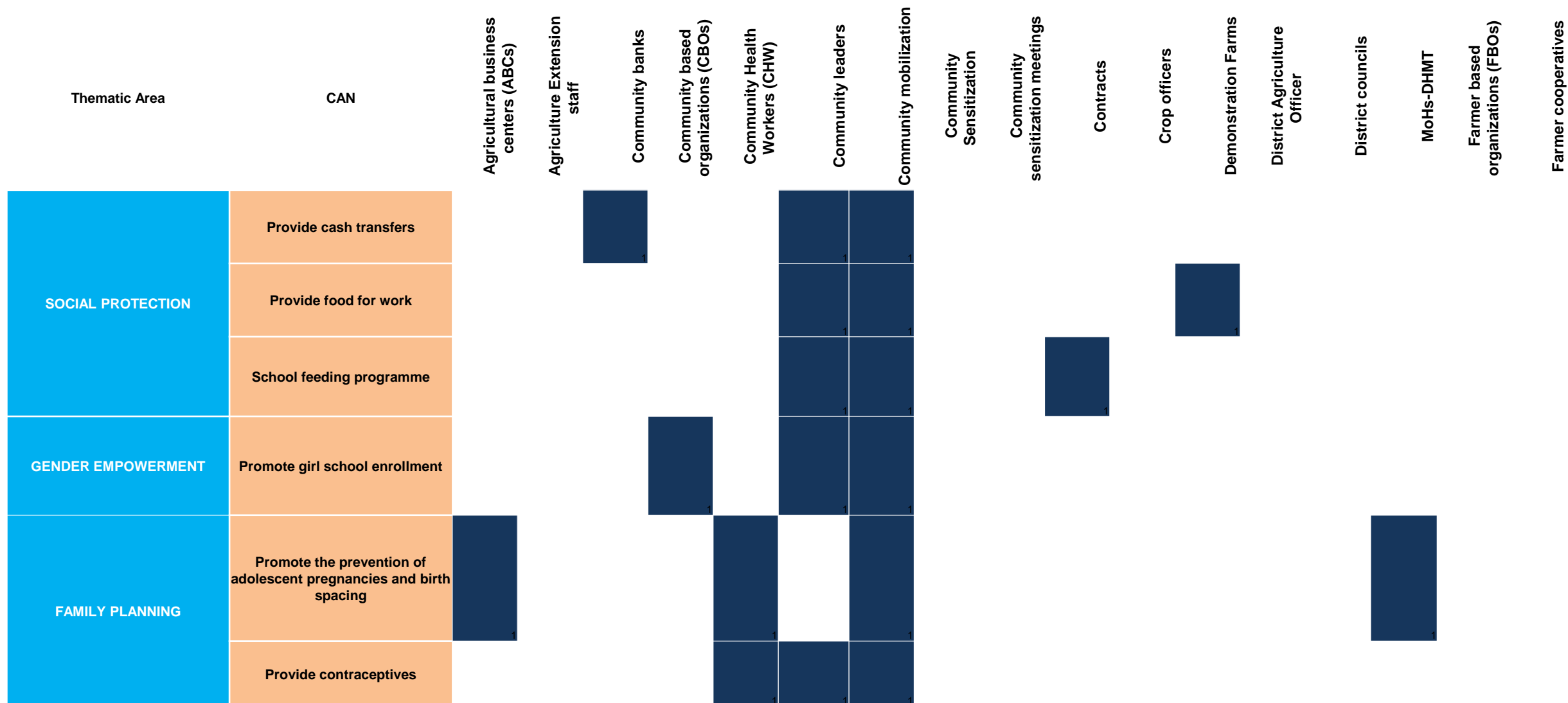

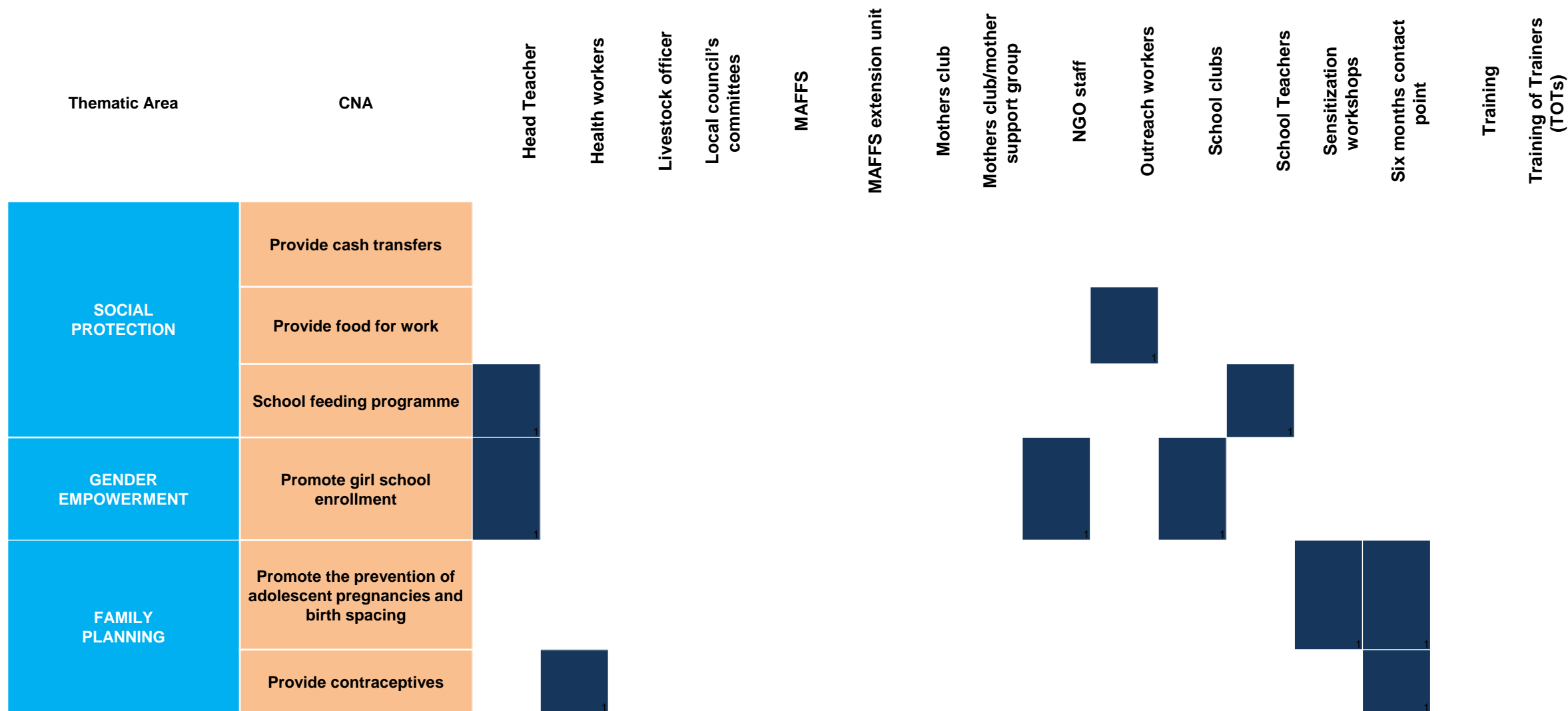
What delivery mechanisms were used to implement the interventions?(7/8)

Prevalence of Wasting (Moderate Acute Malnutrition [MAM]) (%)

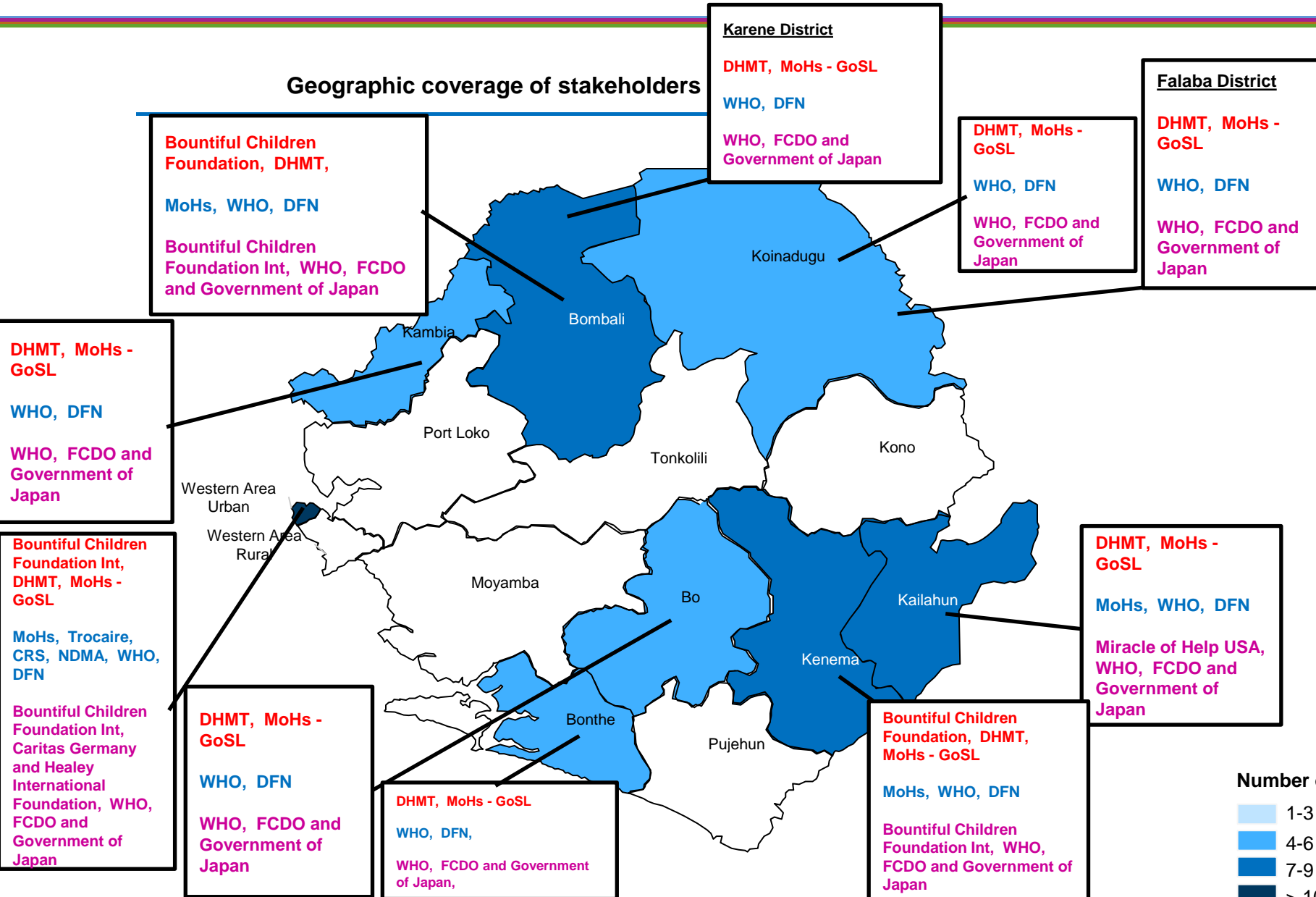

Insights into the values and objectives pursued by interviewed companies



Food -Sufficiency and Malnutrition Mitigation:

- A goal shared among the companies is to make Sierra Leone -sufficient in food production while simultaneously addressing malnutrition-related issues. This indicates a collective commitment towards ensuring food security and improving the population's nutritional status



Policy Alignment:

- Many surveyed companies affirm that they have established goals, policies, and objectives, demonstrating a proactive approach toward achieving their stated missions. Additionally, some companies emphasize their alignment with government policies, particularly those set forth by the Ministry of Fisheries and Marine Resources.



Agricultural Productivity and Sustainable Practices

- Several companies focus on enhancing agricultural productivity by providing farmers with trusted inputs and promoting sustainable farming practices. This underscores a commitment to improving yield and efficiency while safeguarding the environment.



Environmental Stewardship

- A notable proportion of the companies emphasize their dedication to environmental conservation and sustainability. This includes commitments to reducing import dependency, protecting natural resources, and promoting eco-friendly processing methods.



Empowerment and Poverty Alleviation:

- Some companies highlight their efforts towards empowering marginalized groups, particularly women and youth, by providing opportunities for economic participation, such as ownership of farms and income generation. Moreover, there is an emphasis on ending hunger and poverty through agricultural development initiatives.



Fishery Development:

- The specific focus of one company is on developing the fishery sector, with goals ranging from increasing fish availability to promoting fish farming through initiatives like setting up fish ponds.



Adherence to Regulations

- While most companies assert their own goals and policies, one organization operating in the informal sector indicates adherence to government regulations, particularly those outlined by the Ministry of Fisheries and Marine Resources.

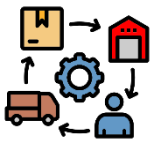
Nutritional Focus

- Many businesses focus on farming practices, including growing crops like rice, vegetables, maize, and cashews, as well as producing honey. This emphasizes the importance of increasing food production locally



Agricultural Production

- Businesses highlight the nutritional aspect of their contributions, either by promoting diverse crops for balanced diets, producing nutritious food blends, or fortifying food products with minerals and vitamins.



Supply Chain Support:

- Several businesses support the agricultural supply chain, such as supplying seeds, fertilizers, and farm machinery, creating market linkages, and offering post-harvest preservation techniques. These activities enhance farmers' capabilities and improve access to markets for agricultural products



Community Empowerment:

- Several businesses aim to empower marginalized communities, particularly women and rural farmers, by providing them with opportunities for income generation, ownership of farms, and access to markets and resources.



Long Term Commitments:

- Some businesses highlight their long-standing commitment to supporting the people of Sierra Leone, indicating continuity and reliability in addressing food security challenges

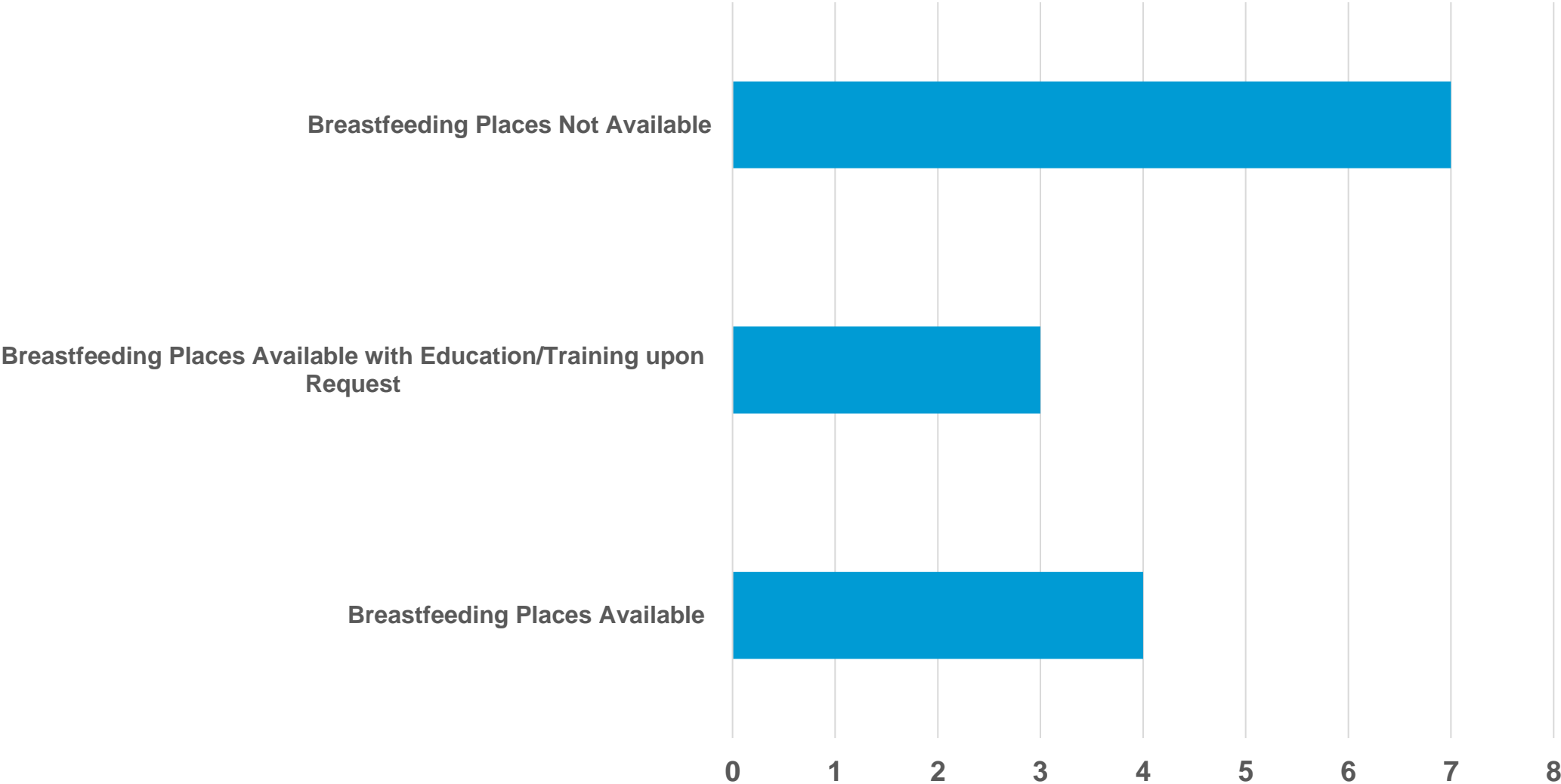

- **The interviewed companies prioritize increasing food production locally, addressing malnutrition issues, and driving initiatives encouraging diverse crops for balanced diets and fortifying food products with essential nutrients.**
- **Many companies we reviewed align their goals and policies with government initiatives, particularly in agriculture and fisheries. This collaborative approach, coupled with adherence to government regulations, reflects their commitment to national development objectives and responsible business practices.**
- **One of the most impactful aspects of these companies' operations is their active empowerment of marginalized groups, such as women and youth. They do this by providing economic opportunities and access to resources. For instance, they offer income generation opportunities and facilitate farm ownership, thereby making a tangible difference in these communities.**
- **Many companies emphasize their long-standing commitment to supporting Sierra Leone's development. Continuity in efforts reflects stability and reliability in addressing food security challenges and promoting sustainable development.**

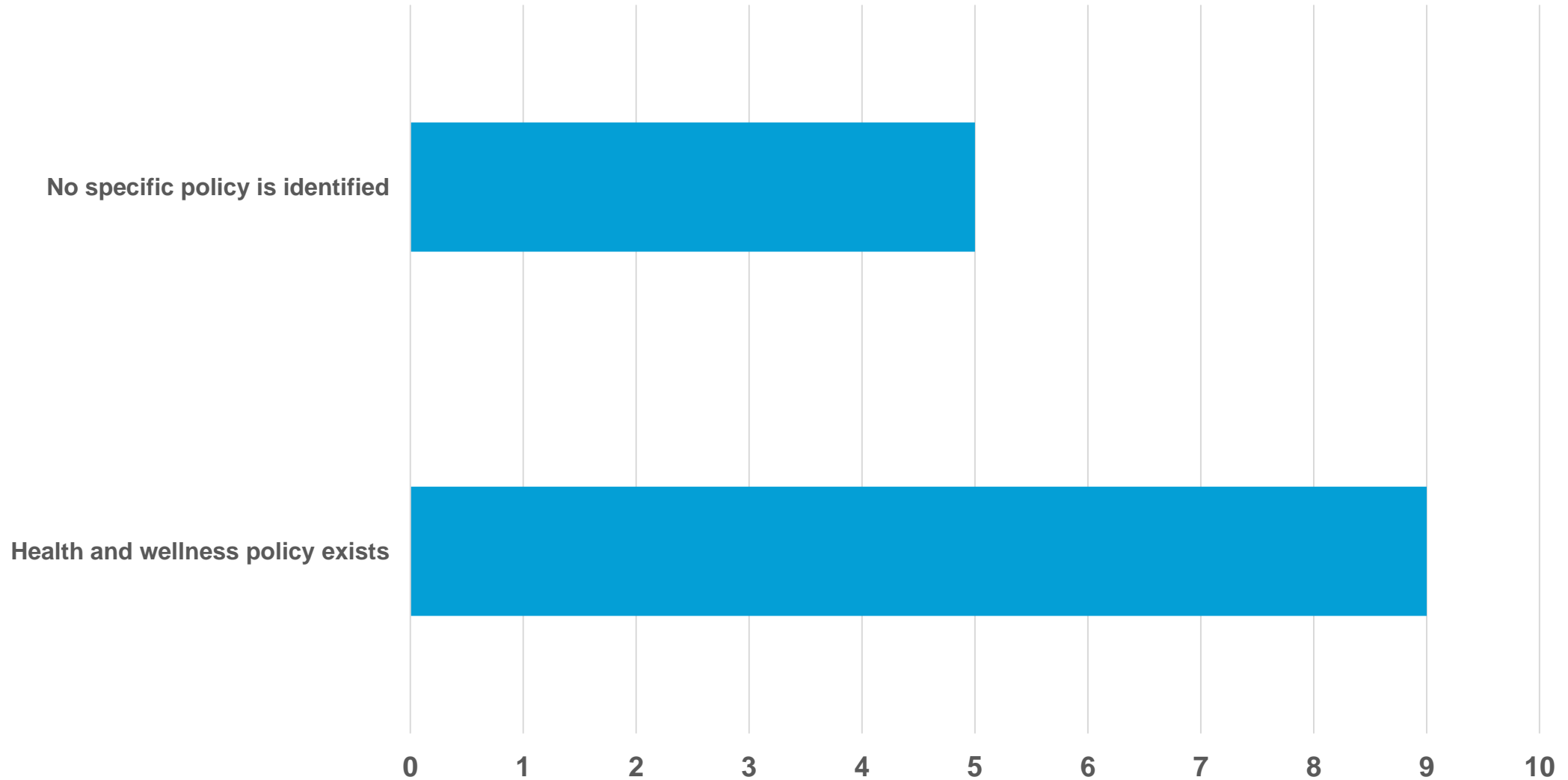
Insights into the workplace support for breastfeeding identified by interviewed companies

Number of Reporting Companies

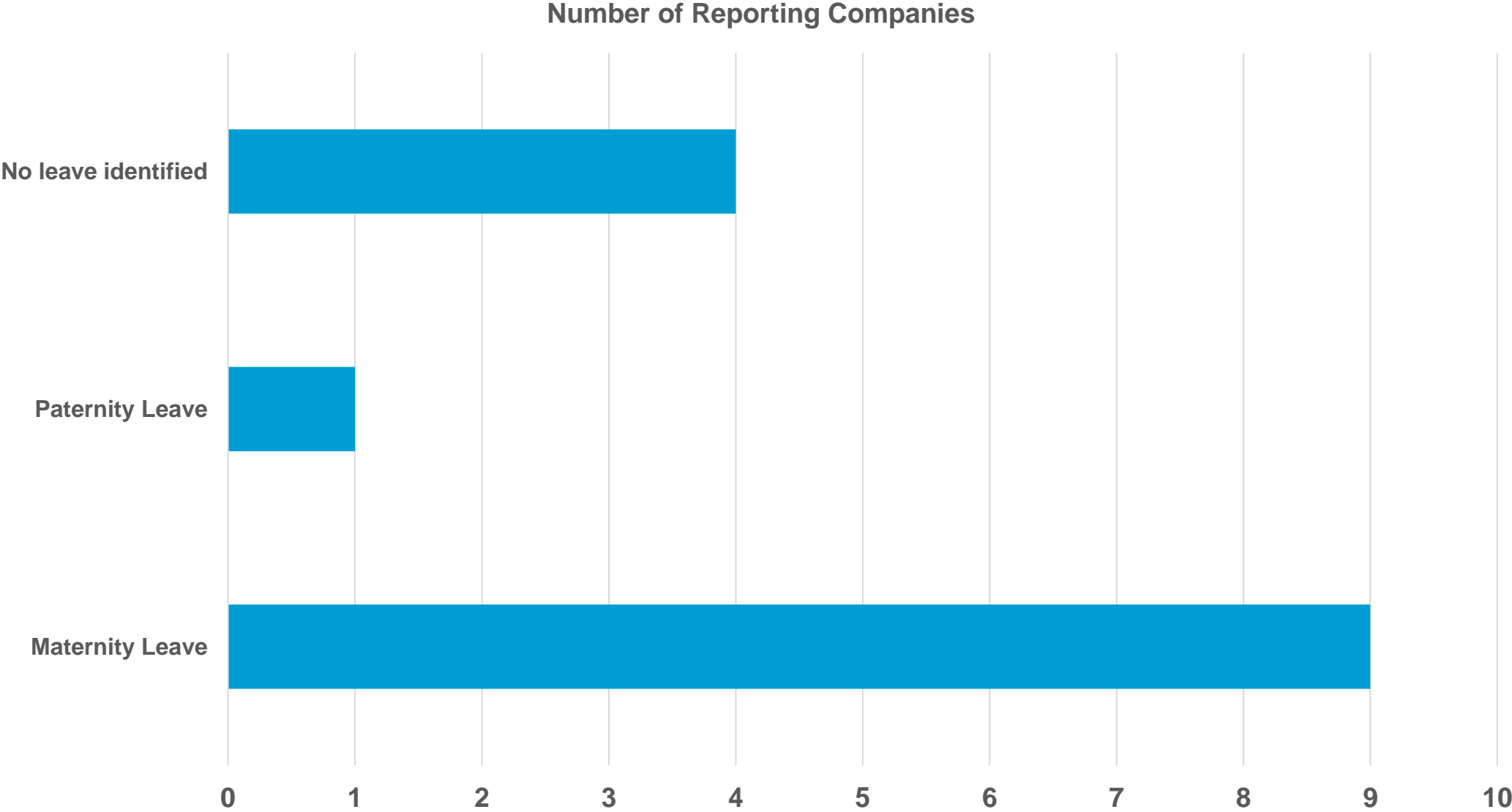


Insights into the workplace support for staff-related wellness policies identified by interviewed companies

Results of the Private Sector Mapping exercise



- Private sector companies in Sierra Leone actively engage with workplace related nutrition issues, particularly concerning breastfeeding support. Among the surveyed companies, it's encouraging to note that three have designated spaces for breastfeeding, highlighting a tangible commitment to supporting mothers in the workplace. However, there are variations in approaches among others, with some companies yet to provide specific spaces.



- For instance, two companies reported not having designated spaces for breastfeeding, while another cited the employee's requiring this service for not providing such a space. However, there are promising signs, such as one company expressing readiness to provide space when the need arises, and another attributing the absence of such a space to staff spending more time in the field. Moreover, some companies have taken alternative approaches to support breastfeeding, such as offering encouragement and education, forming partnerships with the MoHs for educational purposes, or establishing informal arrangements without designated spaces.

Analysis of the work-place commitments to addressing nutrition identified by interviewed companies

Results of the Private Sector Mapping Exercise continued



- These diverse responses underscore the various strategies companies employ to address nutrition issues within their workforce. This data presents an opportunity for collaboration between the private sector and government entities to further enhance support for breastfeeding mothers in the workplace, ensuring the well-being of both employees and their families.



- The analysis of the results regarding maternity leave provision reveals a diverse range of policies among surveyed companies in Sierra Leone. While some companies offer maternity leave with specified durations, salary packages, or informal arrangements, there is a notable absence of paternity leave provisions. This absence not only highlights a gap in support for fathers' involvement in childcare but also suggests potential structural biases in hiring practices, where traditional gender roles may influence decisions. The lack of responses from a significant portion of companies regarding maternity or paternity leave provisions suggests a need for greater transparency and accountability in workplace policies related to parental leave. Addressing these issues is crucial for promoting gender equality, supporting work-life balance, and ensuring the well-being of employees and their families in Sierra Leone's workforce.

Non-workplace Commitments to Nutrition

Results of the Private Sector Mapping exercise



- Two companies, for instance, contribute to the school feeding program through partnerships with the World Food Programme (WFP), underscoring collaboration with international organizations to address nutritional needs within local communities. Additionally, two companies extend their support by supplying rice products to the school feeding program, leveraging their business operations to bolster food provision initiatives.



- Beyond direct involvement with school feeding, one company focuses on broader agricultural sustainability by supporting the government in ensuring food sufficiency, highlighting a strategic alignment with national food security objectives. Another company channels its efforts through partnerships with non-governmental organizations (NGOs) to implement preschool and supplementary feeding programs, targeting vulnerable populations with tailored nutritional support.

Results of the Private Sector Mapping exercise



- Furthermore, innovative approaches to support emerge, such as one company's collaboration with the WFP for training on farm machines, illustrating a commitment to enhancing agricultural productivity and efficiency. Similarly, another company contributes by providing data and training to farmers at the district level, empowering local agricultural communities with knowledge and resources for sustainable food production.



- Notably, one company stands out for its direct engagement with schools, offering affordable fish products and discounts to support school feeding efforts. This targeted intervention underscores the potential for private sector entities to directly impact community nutrition outcomes through tailored product offerings and pricing strategies.



- In essence, these companies' diverse support mechanisms signifies a collective commitment to addressing food security challenges and fostering community resilience. By leveraging their resources, expertise, and partnerships, private sector companies play a pivotal role in complementing government-led initiatives and driving positive social impact at the national and local levels.

7. Key Messages and Discussion Questions

- 13 Responsible Ministries, 69 catalysts, 109 field implementers and 103 donors ensured the implementation of the 30 prioritized key nutrition actions in 2022 in Sierra Leone
- Among the 17 responsible Ministries that ensured the implementation of core nutrition actions in 2022 in Sierra Leone, the MoHs is identified the most across all districts supporting 20 related core nutrition actions.
- On average, each action is implemented in 13 districts. 26 actions cover more than 60% of the districts.
- The districts of Bombali, Falaba, Kambia, Koinadogu, Port Loko and Western rural receive the largest number of actions.
- 33 implementation mechanisms are used. Most of the actions are implemented through community leaders and community mobilizations.
- The results identify gaps in areas where Moderately Malnourished Children seem the most impacted against the number of beneficiaries reached. For example, namely the Bonthe (2.7%), Kenema (1.7%), and Tonkolil (1.2%) have relatively the highest number of beneficiaries supported. These activities are led by the MoHs-DHMTs, and are supported by the WHO, UNICEF and WFP.
- The results also identify a strategic focus on Severely Malnourished Children, where the most impacted areas, namely the Western Urban Area (2.7%), Kenema (1.7%), and Tonkolil (1.2%) have relatively the highest number of beneficiaries supported. These activities are led by the MoHs-DHMTs, and are supported by the WHO, UNICEF and WFP.
